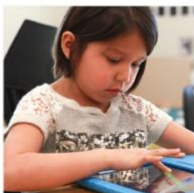

How do full-time and concurrent CBe-learn students register?

Full-time students register directly with CBe-learn and coordinate their programming through CBe-learn student services. Concurrent students, on the other hand, meet with their guidance counsellor at their in-person high school to register for 1-2 courses with CBe-learn -

What is the difference between full-time and concurrent students?

Full-time CBe-learn students are enrolled at CBe-learn for all their courses. In contrast, concurrent students are primarily enrolled at another CBE high school and may take up to two courses with CBe-learn. Concurrent students must be enrolled in at least two courses per semester at their home school as well.

When does registration start?

Transfer requests for the 2025-2026 school year are initiated through the CBE's Transfer Request page. The transfer portal opens February 10th 2025 and closes March 15th 2025 - <https://cbe.ab.ca/registration/transfers/Pages/default.aspx>. Is it mandatory for my child to reside in Calgary to attend CBe-learn?

Yes, our school is funded for students residing in Calgary. Students are required to attend in-person assessments and must reside in Calgary for the duration of the semester.

Is it permissible to live in another city or country while enrolled in CBe-learn courses?

No, students must reside in Calgary and be available for in-person assessments.

Is it possible to complete the course at my own pace?

Courses are structured for a full semester with consistent and ongoing student engagement. Each course includes a checklist with due dates and pacing guidelines that students are expected to follow. While our school offers flexibility regarding a student's daily schedule, it does not allow for fully self-paced completion of courses.

How are students with diverse learning needs accommodated given the set pacing and deadlines?

Students are encouraged to seek support from their teachers to manage course requirements. Teachers will collaborate with students to develop effective support strategies. Additionally, CBe-learn provides a Resource Teacher and Student Services team to assist students with diverse learning needs.

Are there any in-person opportunities or requirements?

Yes, all core courses and some complementary courses have mandatory in-person requirements. Certain complementary courses, such as Art and Leadership, offer optional in-person opportunities for students to work on tasks and interact with peers.

Are online meetings available, and are students required to attend them? What is the format?

Each course includes at least one optional live session per week. While attendance is highly encouraged, students are not required to attend, sessions are recorded for later viewing. Teachers tailor these sessions based on the subject matter and student needs, often expanding on content, clarifying assignment expectations, and addressing student questions.

What constitutes an assessment?

Assessments are tools used by teachers to evaluate student learning. These may include tests, quizzes, research projects, writing assignments, discussions, and more. Each course will outline its specific assessment requirements in the course checklist and content.

How long does it typically take to complete high school, and can students remain enrolled for more than three years?

Typically, students complete high school in three years. However, students may enroll with CBe-learn for additional semesters after their grade 12 year to fulfill any remaining diploma requirements or for specific course upgrading.

What is the procedure for retaking a diploma course?

Alberta Education will blend the highest course mark with the highest diploma mark for any course being retaken. If a student opts not to retake a diploma exam, the highest course mark will be blended with the original diploma mark.
